

NUMERACY

- To recognise and use coins including giving change from 1p - £2
- To understand and learn number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 (including the link between addition and subtraction)
- To understand multiplying and dividing by 2 and 10. To learn by heart the 2 and 10 multiplication tables
- To count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s 10s and 3s.
- To estimate and count larger sets of objects accurately.
- Use Mathematical language to describe location, direction and position. To programme a robot. To use co-ordinates
- To use non standard and standard units of measurement to measure length (height) and capacity.

OTHER CURRICULAR AREAS

- Internet safety
- To learn the names of the young farm animals (duckling, calf etc)
- To learn about food and other things that are produced from farm animals.
- To find out about garden birds and how to look after them.
- To think about man made and natural features of the local environment.

Year 1 and 2

- To speak clearly about things and express opinions giving reasons. To ask a variety of questions.
- To order events in a story and re-tell stories. To learn poetry by heart.
- To use phonics and learned spelling patterns to write words and to learn to read and spell key words. To correctly form all letters including capital letters.
- To use different forms of writing – such as news, labelling a map, a portrait, a letter, an information leaflet. To use punctuation and connectives in sentences.
- Welsh Language: To understand commands, ask and answer simple questions, using farm vocabulary. To read simple texts and write sentences.

These are examples of the skills your child will be learning this half term. They are not set in stone as the learning will be led by the children. These skills can be reinforced with your support by reading regularly with your child, practicing money skills when you shop, playing literacy games in the car, learning tables or by discussing news with your child.
