

## NUMERACY

- . Take part in Mathematical rhymes, songs, stories and games.
- . Count up to 5 objects reliably/10 if possible.
- . Match the number with the correct amount.
- . Understand and use the concept one more/one less.
- . Demonstrate an awareness of the purpose of money through role play.
- . Match and distinguish objects recognising similarities and differences
- . Make marks to represent numbers in their play that have meaning and can be explained.
- . Recognise and use the names for 2D shapes (Cylch, sgwar, petryal, triongl) within play activities and the environment.
- . Demonstrate an awareness of prepositions and movement during their own physical activities (ar ben/on, odan/under, tu ôl/behind,

## ANY OTHER AREAS

- . Be able to recognise and name Pets, Farm animals and animals that live in the Zoo or in the wild.
- . Describe and paint animals
- . Discuss the life cycle of a frog and chick.
- . Activities relating to Chinese New Year, Dydd Gwyl Dewi, Mothers Day, Easter.

## LITERACY

### Animals 'Big and Small'



- . Listen and follow instructions
- . Listen and join in with songs, rhymes, stories.
- . Repeat a story in simple terms
- . Imitate real life and imaginary experiences through role play. (Vets Surgery)
- . Talk about pictures, models, objects.
- . Use newly learned vocabulary in and through play activities
- . Show an interest in books and enjoy their content
- . Recall and talk about visual images and objects
- . Match initial letter sounds with picture cards or objects.
- . Recall details of a story or text by answering open-ended questions or referring to picture prompts
- . Experiment with a range of mark-making instruments and materials across a range of context.
- . Imitate act of writing within role-play activities.
- . Begin to recognise the alphabetic nature of writing and understand that written symbols have meaning

These are examples of the skills your child will be learning this half term. They are not set in stone as the learning will be led by the children. These skills can be reinforced with your support by reading regularly with your child, practicing money skills when you shop, playing literacy games in the car, learning tables or by discussing news with your child.
